Olympics Port Planning

The purpose of the WMCC Olympics Port Planning Committee is to assist the marine community in planning for the 2010 Winter Olympics to minimize any potential disruption to the movement of goods and people to and from the Port facilities and areas identified as Marine Areas of Interest.



Timelines - A Phased in Approach

Host City Olympic Transportation Plan

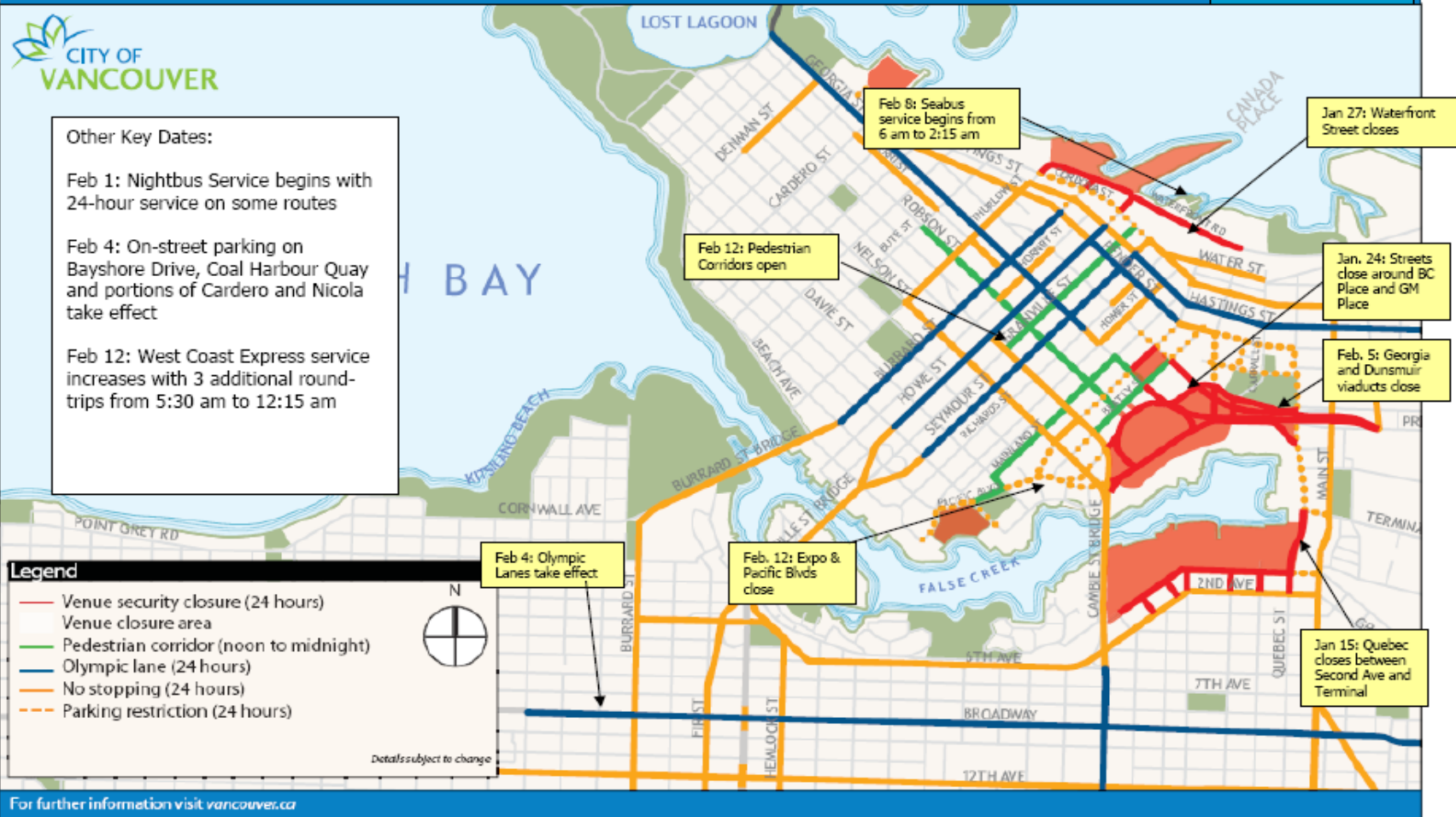


Other Key Dates:

Feb 1: Nightbus Service begins with 24-hour service on some routes

Feb 4: On-street parking on Bayshore Drive, Coal Harbour Quay and portions of Cardero and Nicola take effect

Feb 12: West Coast Express service increases with 3 additional round-trips from 5:30 am to 12:15 am





Movement of Dangerous Goods

- Transport of placarded DGs will only be permitted into the downtown core between midnight and 6:00 am, *but will be allowed 24 hours per day on the perimeter road boundaries of the downtown core*
- Restrictions will be in place for approximately 6 weeks between Jan 26 and Mar 4
- Any DG which require an Emergency Response Assistance Plan (ERAP), IMO Class 1.1, 1.2 and 1.5, and IMO Class 7 will not be handled or moved through the controlled access zones (including Centerm & Vanterm).



Movement of Labour & Essential Services

- BCMEA working actively with transportation providers and employers to ensure dispatched labour is unimpeded moving from hall to terminals
- Taxi service commitments
- Employers' vans and buses prepared to assist
- Subcommittee will identify optimal routing for afternoon shift changes
- ILWU and Cerescorp in discussion on labour requirements for accommodation vessels
- Contingency plans nearly completed



Movement of Labour & Essential Services

- Pilots in discussion with their transportation providers to ensure same
- PPA will encourage earlier dispatch and dispatch to minimize transportation requirements
- Discussions with Tymac Launch for 24/7 standby
- Waterside access being explored by all parties



Movement of Labour & Essential Services

- Canada Border Services Agency will have all primary inspection lanes open from 05:00 – 21:00
- Dedicated lane for athletes, families and delegates at border crossing
- 100+ officers from other regions arriving in January
- Teams and additional equipment will be located throughout Metro Vancouver
- System redundancies to minimize disruptions and facilitate off-site access for officers
- Training program ramping up
- Expect increase vessel inspections



Accommodation Vessels

- Suppliers for accommodation vessels will require a Port Pass with a Transportation Security Clearance (TSC)
- Berths 2 and 3 at Kinder Morgan from Feb 10 – Mar 2
- Berths 3 and 4 at DP World – dates TBA
- No public access to DP World between Jan 25 and 28
– Security Sweep
