

Labour Allocation During The 2010 Olympics

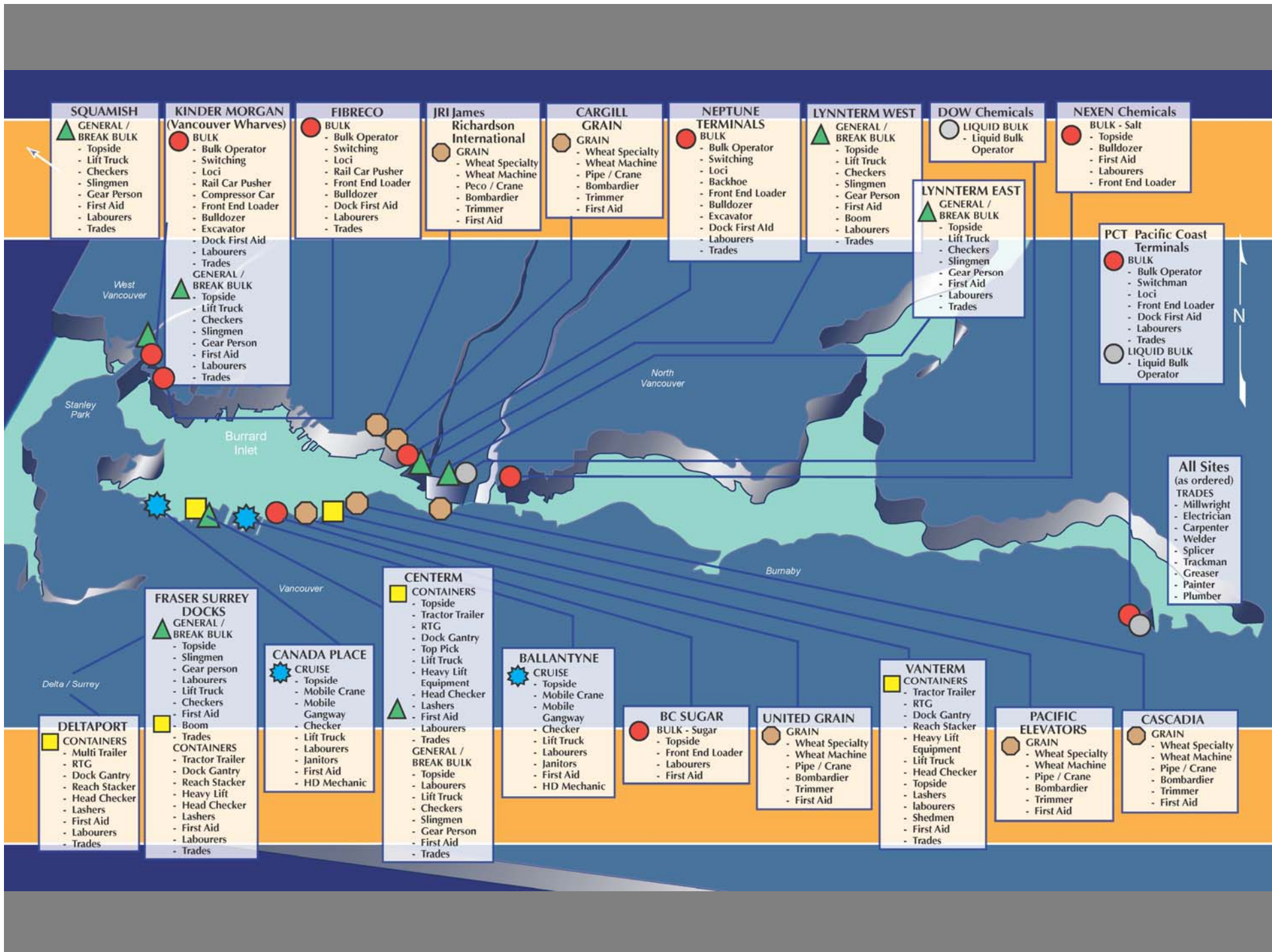

Dispatch Facts

- There is a total of 13 terminal operators and stevedores who order labour in the Port of Vancouver;
- This labour is utilized 24 hours a day across three shifts commencing at 0800, 1630 and 0100;
- BCMEA physically dispatch's a range of labour from 43 employees on the low side and up to 347 employees on the high side per shift;
- Within each shift the BCMEA can physically dispatch up to 28 different skill sets.





Dispatch Of Labour

- **Day Shift:** is dispatched at 0645 hours for the 0800 shift;
- **Afternoon Shift:** is dispatched at 1500 hours for the 1630 shift;
- **Graveyard Shift:** is dispatched at 1600 hours for the 0100 shift;
- BCMEA & ILWU Longshore collective agreement provides voluntary return transportation between the south shore and north shore terminals.



Forecast for Labour

Terminal operators, stevedores and shipping lines on the North Shore forecast their operational requirements for labour during the Olympics to be a minimum of 55 and maximum 170 employees per shift.

Review of Available Transportation Options

Taxis, Bus & Water Taxi

- BCMEA has secured two 52 passenger buses with an option for an additional two 48 passenger buses that will be located on the north and south shore;
- In addition, BCMEA has secured three 40 passenger vessels with an option for additional capacity of one 29 passenger vessel and one 12 passenger vessel.
