

**Deltaport Third Berth Project  
Information Booths Summary  
June 5, 12, 13, 2010**

**Overview**

Port Metro Vancouver (PMV) hosted three information booths during June 2010. Project resource staff and members of the Deltaport Community Liaison Committee (DCLC) were available to speak with the public and to collect input on the Deltaport Third Berth Project (DP3). Passers-by were asked verbal questions regarding DP3 and their comments were recorded. Additionally, information boards were on display for the public to view.
